BLOCK OF THE MONTH – Gerri Fisher

We are so excited about BOM this coming year. We have a lot of new members so this is how it works. Every month you can come back to the BOM table for both the Round Robin and the Block of the Month. Here is more on the Round Robin. We have quilt blocks on the table which will become comfort quilts when they are large enough. You pick a block, take it home, put a pieced or applique border of your creative choice around the block between 1 and 6 inches wide. Bring the block back the following month. You can choose another block every month to put a pieced or applique border on and someone else will pick your block. This will be fun and exciting to see the progression of the blocks. Creativity encourages creativity. This could be a fun time to try out a new skill.

For the Block of the Month you pay \$1. We will have more than 1 month in advance to purchase. For your \$1, you receive a pattern for the next month's quilt block and usually a small piece of fabric to incorporate into the block. Go home and make 2 blocks. One block you bring back to the Guild meeting. Everyone that brings a quilt block back gets placed in a drawing. The winner gets all of the quilt blocks that were returned that month. For the second quilt block you made, you can put all of the quilt blocks for the year from BOM into a quilt for yourself.

Lois Light, Sonja Hernandez and myself encourage everyone to come to the meeting early from 6-7 and you can go ahead and cut your fabric for your block We will have some cutting mats for you.

I also want to encourage members to take advantage of Wednesday Free Sew Day at Second Chance Fabrics from 10-4. I am there every other Wednesday starting Sept 25th. We can work on BOM or any project. Sewing is always more fun with a friend. Also, please let us know of anyone else that has free sewing days so we can post them also.

NAME TAG REMINDER

Don't forget to wear your name tag to the Guild meeting in order to be eligible for new monthly drawing. This is also a chance to show off your quilt style preference (make it pieced, appliqued, fancy or plain). But more importantly it will help other members to get to know you by name.

COMFORT QUILT NEWS – Susan Schara

Last month, due to our continuing "collaboration quilt making," we were able to deliver 4 quilts to DaVita dialysis centers, 5 to Genesis healthcare center, 8 quilts and 3 pillowcases to Sojourn hospice, and 10 quilts to the Marjaree Mason Shelter Program. We have plenty of opportunities for more members to make tops, to volunteer to quilt them, to apply bindings, or to help out in the stash.

At our November meeting you will see the return of Pillowcase Packets, expertly curated from Christmas and winter-themed fabrics, to make it easy for you to have the satisfaction of providing quickly-finished items for hospice patients. Our pillowcase directions produce a durable, attractive pillowcase with completely finished seams, and hospice staff and patients have really liked the ones we have brought them so far. It takes less than 30 minutes to make a pillowcase, so please take a packet or several, enjoy the sewing, and have them ready for delivery in December.

What is "Midnight in Morocco"? It's the theme of the spring fundraising gala put on by the Marjaree Mason Center. We have been invited to make and donate a throw-sized quilt for their silent auction. Wonderful fabrics, rich jewel-tones, gold trim? Could be a fun project for a group of our members to work on after the holidays. Interested? 1. This is a well-done video from Jordan Fabrics about making a quilt from a large panel. It includes a good way to keep your ruler from moving when making a long cut:

2. WW BOM Another nice patriotic quilt from Quilt Jubilee. This one has two ways of setting a batch of red and white HSTs:

3. Have you ever seen this way of making scrappy HSTs? This blog page has links to three videos on making "accordion-sewn" HSTs. You start with squares, and end up with HSTs that are all different - no two alike. Interesting, but I'm not sure it's easier than sewing cut triangles.

5. There are One Block Wonder quilts, and what I would call "One Block Meh" quilts. This one is definitely a Wonder. Instead of yardage, she used panels, stacking 6 of them to cut the blocks, and leaving a seventh one uncut. Click on the image to enlarge it, so you can find the 7th panel, completely surrounded by hexagonal blocks.
