Holiday Quilt Challenge

The holiday season represents many things to each of us. You are asked to bring a quilted item: quilt, wall hanging, table runner or table topper, table decorations, ornaments, clothing or something special that represents your holiday season. If there is a story that goes along with your presentation, please include it on a single page in typewritten form for all of us to enjoy.

Mystery Social Hour

Our social hour will include getting to know our members. Look for the mystery clues on each of your tables and match them with the member or members you think they represent.

JANUARY PROGRAM—Jan Whittington presents a trunk show and a class on 3D quilting and embellishment. With over 20 years' experience and many creative ideas and award-winning quilts, prepare to be inspired. Class will follow on Saturday, January 11 at Second Chance Fabrics from 10am – 4pm. The cost for the class is \$50 for members, which includes the pattern. Attached is the supply list for the class. You can take your own material you want to use or buy it there.

OCEAN FANTASY Approximately 36" by 42"

Supply List:

½ to ¾ yards light blue fabric ½ to ¾ yards medium blue fabric 1/2 to 3/4 yards dark blue fabric fat quarter sand colored fabric fat quarter dark rock textured fabric scraps of blue gray and muddy brown fabric for octopi and snails scraps of fish fabric that can be fussy cut scraps of gold or brown fabrics for starfish Heat n Bond Lite and small amount of Heat and Bond Heavyweight Batting and Backing fabrics for your quilt size Bias binding to bind quilt Small amount sand, shells, and/ or crushed shells Small bits of ribbon in brown, green, orange, or color of choice Eyelash yarn in green (at JoAnn's) Yarn to couch around the border Buttons, beads or crystals (I used blue beads and red crystals) Gold or red glitter paint (optional) Roxanne's Glue Baste it Red Puff paint (optional) Jewel It Tacky glue Monopoly invisible thread for quilting Basic sewing supplies and machine

This is an improvisational quilt. Shapes are cut freeform. I raw edge appliqued shapes as I came to them while quilting in horizontal rows.

I provided some shapes for you to copy but you may find that you need to change shape to fit the area where you are putting the piece.

Senior Quilters - Diana Gardner

If you are unfamiliar with this group, they started about 12 years ago at Quilters' Paradise in the classroom when two ladies decided to do something nice for homebound Seniors in our community. That first year, those two ladies made 18 quilts in two months. Since then the group has grown and shrunk and grown again, and now meets on the first Friday of every month to make quilts. The number of quilts grew along with the number of quilters quilting. Last year they donated 264 quilts to homebound seniors. With the exception of batting, which is purchased, all of the materials are donated by people in our community. Those who provide us with the cash for batting are our "Angels".

UNDERSTANDING THE SEWING MACHINE NEEDLE

The above link will take you to an excellent educational article by Superior Threads on sewing machine needles. Below is the introductory paragraph.

One of the most significant parts of today's home machines is often he least appreciated and most obscure – the needle. A <u>sewing machine needle</u> is a slender strand of metal, shaped to precision, which delivers thread to the machine to create a stitch. We spend thousands of dollars on the most advanced machines, acquire the best digitized designs, use the most lustrous thread, and the most beautiful fabric to produce our projects. But all too often this is all for naught because we either use an old, worn, damaged needle or we use the wrong needle for the fabric. Needles can be damaged by normal use. You don't have to hit a pin while sewing to damage your needle. They can become dull, bent, damaged or get misshapen eyes through normal sewing. All these contribute to frustrating thread breaks and a frayed look on your finished projects. The best advice we can give is this: When you start a new project, start with a new needle. It's the least expensive part of a superior finished project. Overall, a clean, well functioning needle will result in sharp, well-shaped stitches. Needles are inexpensive and easy to change. Keeping a good needle in your sewing machine is one of the easiest, least expensive ways to improve your embroidery and sewing projects.

DOTTIE'S FINDINGS – Dottie Daybell

2019 December Findings

1. Katie Blakesley gives us a series of tutorials on making half rectangle triangles. Start with her two September 29 posts:

At the bottom of her posts is a paragraph beginning "This entry was posted in . . . and tagged . . . ". If you click on "half rectangle triangle tutorial", you'll get all the posts with that tag.

2. QOV BOM Sue's blog is hibernating, but while it was active, she designed a pretty patriotic quilt made from strips. I like the little heart shapes that appear.

Starting from an 8.5" strip set, the two mirror-image blocks each finish to about 11". She doesn't give the width of the dark blue sashing strips, but they'd need to finish to exactly half the finished block size.

3. The Chain Link block is a good way to use up strip scraps. Originally it was done in two colors plus a background, as in these instructions:
