PROGRAMS- Diana Gardner

The January presentation by **Jan Whittington** opened the door to new ways of using materials we don't usually think of for quilters. In the world of quilting, we sometimes forget that a quilt may hang on a wall, adorn the top of a piano, or warm up the corner table with the use of fibers not usually used for making a "quilt". Jan presented the members with many ideas for using more than just cotton fabrics for quilts. She showed us with her trunk show the many creative possibilities that using hard items, such as buttons, beads, sequins, or rocks can add to create the layers and textures of a scene. Her explanations of how she utilized the materials she had on hand to create the fine details was intriguing.

Jan has agreed to set a new date for her workshop later in the year. Watch for the date in upcoming newsletters.

FEBRUARY PROGRAM

The February meeting will feature Lora Wheeler and Upcycled Garments (or How I took the Lessons from Scrap Quilting and Made New Clothes),

Pat Robertson will be providing us with her trunk show in March. Pat is a traditional quilter, beginning in 1989. All her quilts were hand quilted until 2000. She has won Best of Show at Road to Calif., Utah State Festival and Best of the Valley, with numerous 1st place ribbons, the most recent at Pacific International last October. She will talk about her journey into quilting and bring 25-30 quilts to share and talk about. She has a strong focus on applique.



COMFORT QUILT NEWS – Sharon Schara

It's time to give some recognition to Comfort Quilt Superstars, also known as Friends of Comfort Quilts. Chris Chapman, of course, turns in a dozen or so quilts on a regular basis, usually quilted and ready to be bound by Fanchon Owen. Fanchon's business card reads, "Happiness is helping," and she is obviously happy to help bind as many comfort quilts as we send her way. Carol Mills-Henry likes to take several quilt top kits at every meeting, and turns in 6 or more tops the next month. Kim Killian, one of the volunteer longarmers, asks to have 6 of our largest quilting kits set aside for her each month, and even attaches the first side of the bindings. Irene Allen and her sister, Pauline Beaton, like to hand-finish those bindings. Other Friends Sue Vildosola, Irene, and Donna Coppin, have donated quilt top/quilt back combos. Additional volunteer quilters include John Lilly, Tracy Newkirk, Frances Jameson, Carol Shervem, Susan Schara, and Dee Mooneyham.

Returning member **Cindy (Plummer) Katsura** deserves nomination for the Independent Stash Utilization award: she brought 9 comfort quilt tops to the stash room, found whole cloth backs or fabric for pieced backs and bindings for all of them, and accepted a big bag of large batting scraps which she will combine to make batting for all nine comfort quilts! It took her just about an hour (and just a little help from the Stash Mistress).

DOTTIE'S FINDINGS – Dottie Daybell

February 2020 Findings

1. Maria Shell is posting a retrospective of her quilts, starting with 2004:

Hover your cursor over an image to see the name of the quilt. Click an image to make it larger She will be doing more posts, tagged "Year in Quilts". Tag is at the upper right, under the date.

2. QOV BOM This scrappy quilt by Jessica Dayon is good for a group quilt. She uses two different star blocks: 12" Variable Stars with 4-patch centers, and 6" Friendship Stars.

You could substitute plain setting triangles for the half and quarter stars, perhaps in a dark color. But don't abandon the on-point setting!

3. Jayne used a bunch of scraps, plus a cream solid, to make this easy stacked quilt. I like her use of different widths.

Her tutorial is well-done, so I forgive her for saying "Viola" instead of "Voilá", even though that's one of my pet peeves. (I wonder how she pronounces it?)

4. Wanda is making a scrap quilt with equilateral triangles. I love the way she's using the small triangles to create light-colored diamonds with heart shapes below them. She's using Australian aboriginal fabric she collected several years ago. The triangles measure 8" and 4" on a side.




