She is President of the Valley Quilt Guild (Marysville/Yuba City CA) and a retired teacher who sings and dances.... You will receive an email a few days before with instructions to join in. You will need a computer and internet, although any cell phone or tablet will do. If you can stream your computer to a big TV, you'll be able to see even better. And look for show and tell by our members following her presentation.

August will likely be our first general meeting in person back at Hope Lutheran Church.

Our Nominating Committee has completed their work and the nominated officers beginning September 1 are: Joanie Martin for President, Pat Baker for Vice President, Reneeta Anthony for Treasurer and Diane Sakamoto for Secretary. Nominations are open for all four positions, just call me or any Board member. The Guild members will vote in August to elect and install new officers, effective September first.

Your Board approved modifications to our Policies & Procedures and the new document will be on our website soon. We will no longer charge visitors to our meetings for their first two visits. A \$5 fee will be charged on third and following visits. A \$15 non-member fee will be charged for workshops, retreats, educational seminars and opportunities, but not for trips. And all who join or renew their membership through September 30, 2020 get the special COVID-19 rate of just \$20 for the entire year.

We have asked before for pictures and stories of your quilting quarantine creations and adventures and are still interested in sharing your experiences with other members by email. We also welcome anyone who would like to share a studio tour by video and a short tutorial on a topic of general interest. Call **Diana Gardner** or me and we will make it happen. These "Coffee Break" video or Zoom meetings have been a big hit at other guilds.

Finally, be preparing your quilts for our quilt show November 13-14. We can display up to 100 quilts and would love to share our art with the Fresno/Clovis community and beyond.



"MASS MASK PROJECT" – Joanie Martin & Beverly Kuykendall

Beginning in April of this year our guild sought to respond to the COViD-19 pandemic by organizing a mass mask drive. **Barbara Pearson** and **Reneeta Anthony** took charge of organizing fabric, cutters and sewers and to figure out who would pick up the completed masks and deliver them. The time and organization of these two women made this daunting task doable!

In May they passed the baton to **Beverly Kuykendall** and **Joanie Martin**. As of the last pick up on June 15th, our guild has made and delivered over **4,500 masks**! We also have over 200 masks safely stored and ready for delivery. Our spreadsheet indicates we have had 30 guild members and friends who have "officially" donated their time, effort, money and the pads of their fingers to this endeavor!

And I know that this is only the tip of the ice berg in mask making that has happened in the past three months. **EVERY** quilter and seamstress I have spoken with has shared the masks they have made. Many being sent all over of the country.

With the current spike in the virus, I would not be surprised if we get a call from one of our past recipients asking for more masks!

Many guild members have regularly contributed to the mask making for the guild. The top five contributors to the mask making project are **Chris Chapman, Barbara Pearson, Diane Dunn, Joanie Martin and Beverly Kuykendall**. By contributor we mean the final product. It cannot be stressed enough that the team of workers who made this project a success did a lot of jobs: Washing and ironing fabric, procuring elastic from all over the world(!) and making it the right size for a mask, cutting fabric, cutting ties, pressing ties, pinning elastic and ties and more jobs!

But really one guild member and her husband went beyond the "call of duty." **Mike and Pauline Beaton** "tag teamed" their mask making and made over 2,526 masks for the Guild and 369 for family and friends for a total of 2895 masks to date! Sewn beautifully, they would be neatly stacked in a bag in groups of 100 to be picked up. Sometimes there would be FOUR bags!

Thank you Pauline and Mike for graciously giving of your money, time and effort on the behalf of our guild to keep our community safe!

DOTTIE'S FINDINGS – Dottie Daybell

July 2020 Findings

1. Sandra in Ontario, Canada has made something wonderful I'll never make! A kaleidoscope pillow using Paula Nadelstern fabric. She shows us some of her steps:

It's refreshing to see it, in these days of way too many 16-patches.

2. QOV BOM. Mary is a prolific maker of Quilts of Valor. Here's a new pattern she recently posted, using Rail Fence and Friendship Stars. First the description, second a page with a link to a PDF:

3. Cynthia in Oregon started with some pretty scraps from another quiltmaker, and did a nice job of using them, adding a few of her own scraps. I like the varying widths and the way she quilted it.

4. When you want to set blocks at a tilt, you frame the block with wide straight strips, and then lay a square ruler over it, at an angle, and trim off a wedge-shaped scrap from each side. Em has a way to do it without creating those scraps:

She just eyeballs the tilt angle, so it might differ from block to block. If you wanted them all the same, it should work to put a narrow strip of painter's tape on your ruler, at the desired angle, and line the tape up with the straight edge of the strip. (I leave that last bit as an exercise for the reader!) By the way, I make narrow strips of blue tape by sticking a length of wide tape onto my cutting mat, aligning it with the grid so it's straight, and then cutting it into 1/4" strips using an old rotary blade.

COMFORT QUILT NEWS – Susan Schara 'No contact' pick-up of fabric or kits and drop-off of comfort quilts during this time. Contact Susan Schara (227-9788)

Well, the Quilters' Quarantine goes on, with pretty amazing results as far as productivity is concerned: as of May 19th, there are 77 comfort quilts awaiting delivery, 4 already dropped off for Kases for Kids, 4 being bound, and 10 or more in the homes of volunteer quilters.

The various Friends of Comfort Quilts are continuing to shop the stash, make tops, make backs, prepare quilting kits, quilt, and bind, and seem to be enjoying every minute. They are busy, as in a no-contact beehive, or a no-pressure sweatshop. Bored? I don't think so. Members are experimenting with techniques, fabrics, colors, and quilting patterns they haven't tried before, using up scraps, making room in their own stash and the guild stash. Our current quilt collection has numerous examples of beautiful quilts that, deep in our hearts, we wish we could keep, but which we will donate in order to benefit others. Yay, us! Just keep on keepin' on, eagerly looking forward to our next chance to be together.

Don't forget Hobbs UPC codes! Remember to check your sewing room—maybe there's a packaged, precut Hobbs batting just waiting to be used in your next project. Cut the UPC code from the plastic wrapping, send to Susan, and our guild can qualify for a hefty discount on the comfort quilt batting we use up so rapidly these days. We have one UPC already, so we just need 4 more. (This offer is for guilds, not individual quilters—sorry.)

We're so excited to be bringing you the 2nd annual retreat in Fresno. Come and enjoy yourself pushing your pedal on your sewing machine as we will have a fun time, visiting with friends and making new ones. This year this retreat starts Thursday, November 5th at 1:00 p.m. and ends on Saturday, November 7th at 4:00 p.m. Three days of sewing fun!

This retreat is a no-frills retreat. You will bring your own projects – maybe even finish a few... There will be a raffle – or two – or three. Maybe play Bingo. When you need to take a break, Kiki's is just across the way and Sew & Vac nearby.

This year's retreat is \$135.00 for all three days. This includes dinner on Thursday, lunch and dinner Friday and a late lunch on Saturday. Arrival/closing time are: Thursday 1:00p.m. to 10:30p.m. (please do not come early as we might not be set up); Friday 8a.m. to 10:30p.m. and Saturday 8:00a.m. to 4:00p.m. sharp. There will be water available, but are asking everyone to bring your own mugs/cups (remember this is a no-frills retreat).

More on irons later – not sure we will be able to bring individual irons. And because we're at a church no alcohol is allowed.

A deposit of \$35.00 non-refundable is due by July 15th 2020. I suggest you send your money in early as this retreat might fill up quickly. Balance of \$100.00 is due by October 1st 2020. I will be emailing out more into in October. Remember this retreat is open to all.


