DOTTIE'S FINDINGS – Dottie Daybell

August 2020 Findings

1. Carole begins free motion quilting a Hoffman panel, and shares all the planning and sketching she's doing:

2. QOV BOM. Becky from Quilted Twins designs interesting scrap quilts. This one is simple to make from large half-square triangles. I think scrappy reds and blues, with lights, would look nice. The two colors could be scattered, or do columns of red and columns of blue.

She used 7" cut squares and 2" cut strips to end up with 6" finished blocks set with 2" cut, 1.5" finished, sashing. If you're using precuts or fat quarters, it will be less wasteful to start with 5" cut squares (or 4.5" strips with an Easy Angle ruler) to get 4" finished HSTs, and cut 1.5" sashing to finish at 1", to keep the same proportions of block and sashing.

3. This is a good block for featuring large scale prints or novelty prints. It's like a flower or a chunky star. Afton of Quilting Mod found it in a 2018 sew-along from Sharon Holland. In her post, Afton links directly to the download page for that block; I've added a link to Sharon's website, with her other sew-along patterns. I like Afton's fabrics better than the originals.

COMFORT QUILT NEWS – Susan Schara 'No contact' pick-up of fabric or kits and drop-off of comfort quilts during this time. Contact Susan Schara (227-9788)

It's been such a long time since we've met in person, I just hope I can remember everybody's name! Looking forward to it, though...Through June and July, the world of comfort quilts has been chugging right along: Quantities of our stash fabrics have been donated to the cause of mask-making, and have benefited people in medical and non-medical locations in our community. **Nancy Christian** facilitated two large donations of stash fabric to replenish our supply, with mostly whole yard pieces or larger—thanks so much, Nancy. **Cindy Katsura** and her mother-in-law have made and donated 140 quilting kits, with tops largely from her own fabric, also backs and binding, and needing only batting to be ready for volunteer quilters. **Gerri Pymm** prepared 11 kits, and former member **Nancy Decker** made 9 tops for comfort quilts. **Sandy Clark** brought us a large amount of batting she had bought but never used. **Judy Bibb** gave us several completed quilts. **Jan Kinney** surprised us by taking <u>all</u> of our collected orphan blocks to turn into tops; we'll have photos for you when she's done. Thank you all for the many different ways you support our donation program.


Speaking of donation: **Beverly Kuykendall** has, in the last two months, gone through every bin of fabric in the stash, sorting, organizing, and discarding pieces too small to be useful. What a job! We now have room available for quilting fabric you no longer need, and will be happy to have it.

Great news! Most of our recipient agencies are able to receive comfort quilts from us once again. We have provided 39 quilts to hospice, 19 to a dialysis center, and 75 to the Marjaree Mason Shelter Program. Yes, your sewing skills really do make a difference to others in our community.

We currently have more than 20 quilting kits especially for those members who think they can't be volunteer quilters because they don't have a long arm quilting machine. These kits involve printed panels or other "cheater cloth" tops, and are well-suited to straight-line quilting following lines in the tops! All it takes is an ordinary domestic sewing machine, a walking foot (sometimes called an "even-feed" foot), and a motivated member ready to give it a try. How about it? Many of these kits will make really cute quilts for babies and children who may be needing a security blanket nowadays. If you call ahead, Susan can set out several of these kits in the stash for you choose from, or will deliver to your front porch. Hope to hear from you, or even <u>see</u> you, soon!


Don't forget Hobbs UPC codes! Remember to check your sewing room—maybe there's a packaged, precut Hobbs batting just waiting to be used in your next project. Cut the UPC code from the plastic wrapping, send to Susan, and our guild can qualify for a hefty discount on the comfort quilt batting we use up so rapidly these days. We have one UPC already, so we just need 4 more. (This offer is for guilds, not individual quilters—sorry.)
