The 12" blocks are set in columns separated by 6" strips; border is 6". For our 48" width, omit the borders, or make the 6" strips narrower and add a narrow border. Add a row of stars to get our longer length.

3. Quilt Diva embarked on a challenging project to finish a 1970s string quilt top her friend had inherited. Start at the link, then click the label "70s Quilt" under the post, just above the comments, to see all her posts.
