

COFFEE BREAK - CRAZY QUILT PROJECT

Here are my general instructions. For more specific ideas. please use your computer fingers and go to the "YouTube" videos or search Crazy Quilt designs. When all else fails, call me, Diana Gardner (559) 978-0706.

- 1. Size is your choice. Remember, we want to send photos of our work to John for the Show and Tell in our April meeting.
- 2. The fabric selection is fancies, silks, satins, velvets, velveteens, polished cottons, crepes and whatever else I can find in my stash. Joanie has provided the wonderful Thai silks or use your own stash.
- 3. You will receive pieces that are about 12" x 12". You may use as much or as little of each fabric as you like. You are not limited to what is in the kit. You are welcome to add to it. Remember, "More is Better" in Victorian times.
- 4. You will need a stabilizer fabric. It can be plain muslin, or any kind of fabric with a firm weave that will stabilize your stitching. You just have to be able to get a threaded needle through multiple layers. Some members are using paper.
- 5. Special awards, events, and memories were added to crazy quilts. Think BIG!
- 6. Embellish! Embellish! Think Victorian ladies sewing circles where they sat and stitched many decorative motifs to go on a collar, cuff or piano top.
- 7. Have Fun!...Enjoy!

1. This is a clever little handmade tool for lining up a triangle on the corner of a square:

2. QOV BOM I like the paired 9" Sawtooth Stars in this older pattern from McCall's Quilting:

It would work well in patriotic colors. And you could substitute 9" x 18" finished rectangles for the strip-pieced blocks, or use wider strips.

3. The Iowa Quilt Museum's Facebook page has photos from "String Theory", its exhibit of string quilts old and new. Be sure to read all the comments next to each slide. I wish there were a catalog, but there's good info in some of the comments:

4. Ann has been working on this beautiful quilt for two years. It uses a vintage 1930s block from Aunt Martha, which she probably redrafted. I love her stars, and her applique border. Click on the tag "Shadow Star" if you want to see all her posts on this project.
