Congratulations to **Pauline Beaton** who won the Block of the Month drawing in July for her lipstick block.



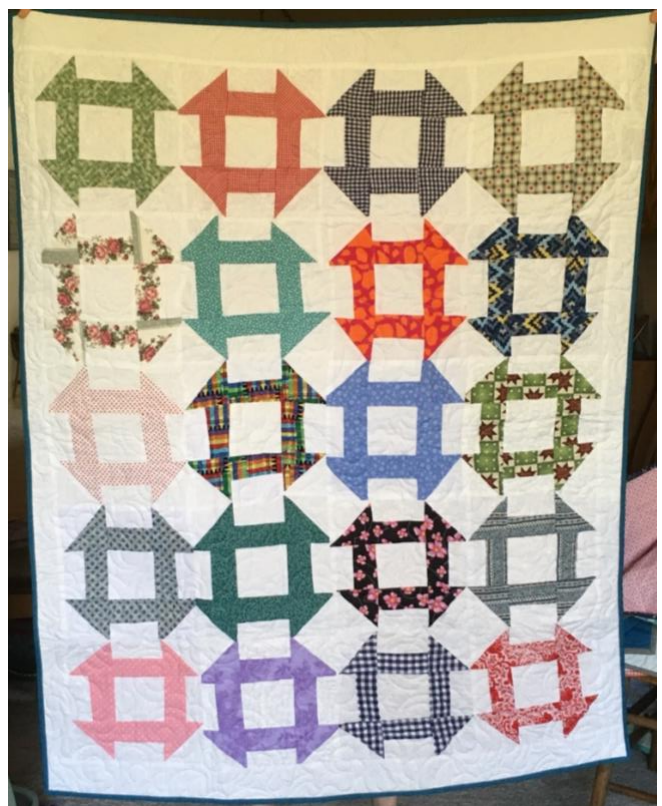
COMFORT QUILT NEWS – Susan Schara

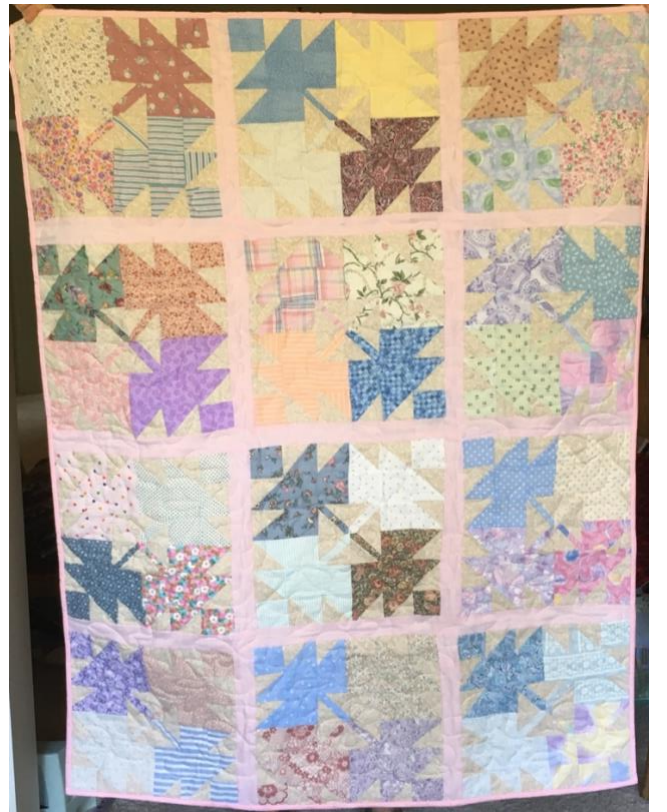

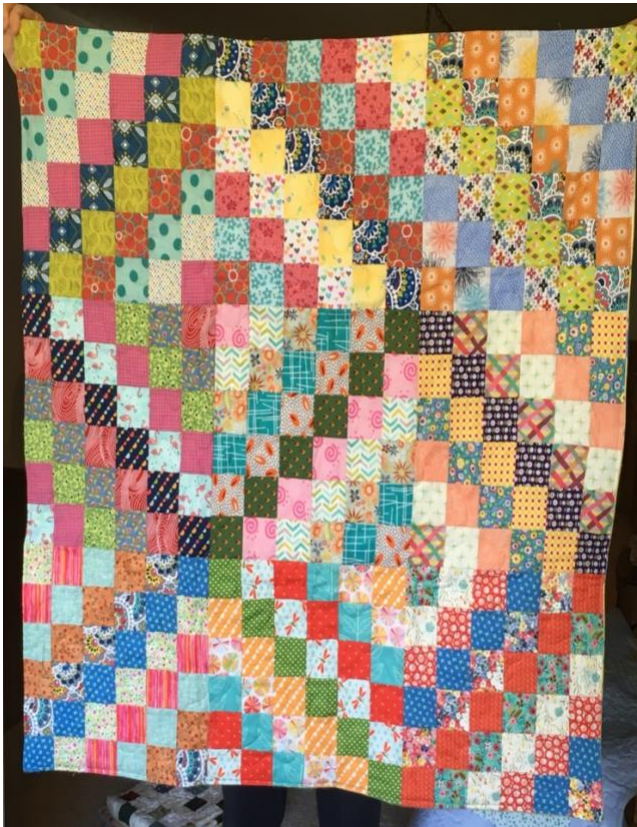




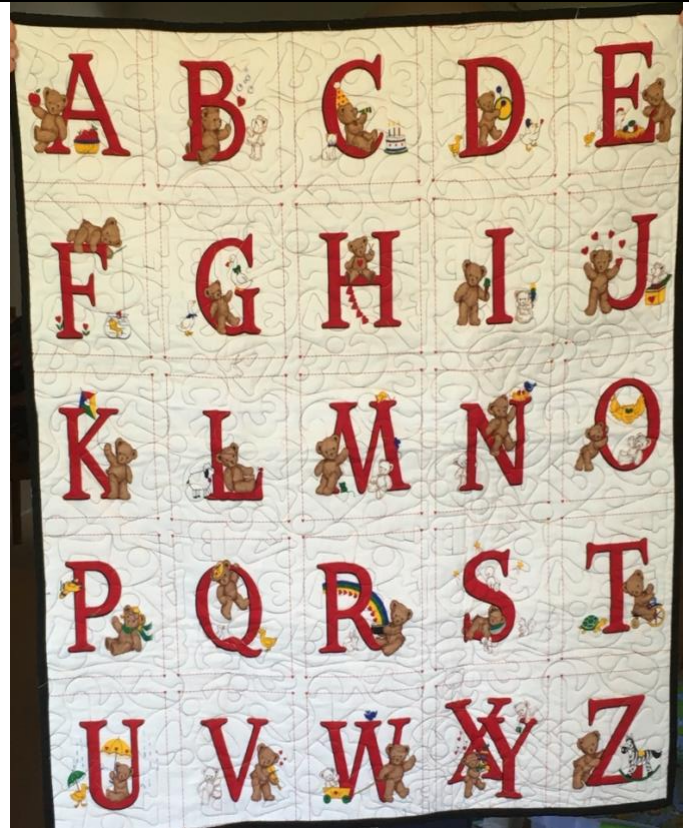

SEPTEMBER PROGRAM – “Minimal Design, Maximum Impact” Lecture by **DAVID OWEN HASTINGS** - David is a quilter, graphic designer, print and textile artist, and a former President of the Seattle Modern Quilt Guild. He creates contemporary art and modern minimal quilt and textile designs. David's creative approach to modern quilting has led to a busy schedule of workshops and lectures on quilting, branding for artists, art and textile techniques.

This talk gives an overview of his process for coming up with simple graphic quilt designs, starting with stitched paper models (called maquettes). he shows examples of how to translate an architectural photo into a quilt design and has many samples of mini quilts he created using this process. The techniques he presents are also great for making unique modern quilt block designs. DISBURSEMENTS AND ACTIVITIES IN JUNE 2021: Three checks were cashed by Ellen Linder, paid for our June speaker (\$350); Hope Lutheran Church paid for June rent (\$225); and Brian Tritch paid for technical services at the meeting (\$105). One deposit was made for Bank Interest (.74).

BUDGET DEVELOPMENT FOR 2021-22: The annual budget planning process began in July, with the FY 2021-22 Draft Budget presented and discussed on July 15, 2021, at the SJVQG Board meeting. The resulting draft budget for FY 2021-22 is included in this July, 2021 newsletter. This proposed budget takes into consideration past years actual income and expenses, COVID actual expenses, and the estimate of continuing a mixed meeting hybrid for 2021-22. The income is estimated to increase 240% for FY 2021-22, with expenses increasing approximately 74%. This recommended budget will be presented for adoption at the SJVQG Board meeting on August 13, 2021.

DOTTIE'S FINDINGS – Dottie Daybell

AUGUST 2021 FINDINGS

1. In this tutorial, Susan gives us a clever way to change a pattern's template to a rotary-cut piece:

2. Patriotic BOM I think Cathy's scrappy quilt, with stars embedded in 16-patch blocks, would work in red-white-blue. The blocks use 4" cut squares and finish at 14". I'm getting tired of wonky, so would probably make my stars un-wonky. Cutting 3.5" squares for the star points means they'll be well away from seams.

3. Quiltmania's blog has a free pattern for a pretty block that's a hybrid of regular Log Cabin and Pineapple Log Cabin. It's from a 1920 Swedish quilt. The blog credits a Swedish book it says was from 1933, but that should be 1993. It's also in my copy of the 1995 English translation of that book: Old Swedish Quilts, by Asa Wettre.

4. Deb Jeske posted about a La Conner, WA exhibit of quilts made by Matt Macomber, who creates interesting settings for vintage blocks. 5. A viewer of the above discussion asked Matt about fabric history, and when 36" wide fabric was replaced by wider fabric. As I recall, in the early 1950s, when I was in high school, we made our dresses from 36" cotton, but 45" fabric came soon after that. Google found an interesting site, which agreed with that date. (After reading this article, click the "Vintage Fabrics" category in the right hand sidebar to see several more articles.)

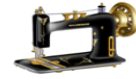
