Planning For the Future

While Visiting Guatemala I was daily bombarded by scenes of everyday life while traveling to and from our medical clinic on a bus. I'd see vendors opening their stalls with fruit, tortillas or housewares. One afternoon in Jalapa we came across a herd of cattle that were being moved via the main road! People, cars and cattle merging! What a sight!

To insure our safety and that of the Guatemalan workers and the people we came to serve, our team was limited to our clinic, hotel and bus. Only on our last day, with negative COVID test results were we able to venture into some parts of the city of Antigua.

To actually walk the streets that I had observed from my bus window was a gift. The people, the food, the colors, the myriad of woven fabrics on people and in stores were amazing! We entered one courtyard and found two women sitting on the tile floors weaving. One of the weavings really caught my eye and it is now in my home!

But the vision of these two women is still in my memory and I am "still in Guatemala". The photo above is a photo of them and the beginning of a fabric portrait that I am *planning* to do in the near future. The perspective in this photo is called "vista de pajaro" or birds-eye view. The subject matter, scenes of everyday life, "art naif," like those I saw from the bus or on my walk through the city, is also very common.

Planning for a portrait like this begins by enlarging the photo. The finished piece will be 36" x 48". I'm also auditioning fabrics for the quilt. In my next letter I hope to show a photo of my partially done piece!

The board of our guild is also doing a lot of *planning*. In our meetings we discuss items that should be in the newsletter to keep you informed. Sharon Pryor is *planning* the best way to get you the membership list for this year in PDF and hard copy forms. Carol Shervem is *planning* ways to share our opportunity quilt before our drawing in April. And Diana Gardner is *planning* for our December potluck celebration and for meetings for the new year.

I'm also *planning* to greet you and enjoy your company and your Christmas quilts at our meeting in December. I hope you can come!

San Joaquin Valley Quilters Guild Challenge Quilt Guidelines – Pat Baker March 2022

Time to get your creative juices flowing and your hands and machines sewing to prepare an entry for the March 2022 quilt challenge. We have had lots of sunshine this summer so one of the challenges will be to see just how you use this beautiful "mellow yellow" fabric.

Here are the official guidelines (and the judges will have their rulers ready)



Quilt must be no larger than 24 x 24 inches
You will receive a fat quarter of the yellow fabric and
must have at least 4 inches of the yellow fabric showing
Red fabric, mostly solid will also need at least 4 inches showing.

Must have 3 pinwheels (only 3)

Must be completed with binding

Any style of quilt making will be accepted

First Prize: \$100 Second Prize: \$75 Third Prize: \$50 Viewers' Choice.....\$25

The yellow fabric will start being available at the November guild meeting. You must be a current member of the SJVQG to participate.

Judging will be at the March 10, 2022 Meeting







Please make sure your entry is hidden in a bag or container when you submit it at the March 10th meeting. Your name is on the quilt back and can be covered up prior to the judging.

DISBURSEMENTS AND ACTIVITIES IN OCTOBER 2021: Six checks were cashed by: Reneeta Anthony (\$223.16) reimbursement for purchases made for Opportunity Quilt 2022 items and office supplies, and (\$44.46) reimbursement for purchases made for Opportunity Quilt 2022 items; Southern California Council of Quilt Guilds (SCCQG) for (\$342.50) annual Insurance coverage and membership for the SJVQG and (\$10) for an insurance certificate for the 21st Agricultural District; Donna Chipperfield (\$374.40) for reimbursement for purchasing Comfort Quilt batting; and, Hope Lutheran Church (\$225) paid for the October rent. Five deposits were made for Bank Interest (.63): Opportunity Quilt 2022 (consisting of three deposits of \$225, \$795.94 and \$705); and Membership (\$610).

FREE MEMBERSHIP: The free membership was drawn at the October SJVQG meeting with Tracy Newkirk receiving the \$35 membership for 2021-22.

LAST CHANCE AUCTION: The Last Chance Auction held during the SJVQG October 14, 2021, meeting net income of \$248.43 for the Guild with expenses of \$16.57 and gross income of \$265. "Thank you" to Diana Gardner and her team of workers who made this evening event not only fun but a successful night!

FRESNO FAIR 2021: The Opportunity Quilt 2022 sales at the 21st Agricultural District "Fresno Fair" were successful selling 221 books and 404 single opportunity Quilt tickets, for a total of 1,461 tickets. Gross Revenues for our guild during the Fresno Fair total \$1,497.94. "Thank you" to Carol Shervem and to all of the volunteers who braved the cold days and evenings to make this fundraising event a Guild success!

1. This scrap quilt looks more complicated than it really is. It's just equilateral triangles. She pieces them like Gwen Marston taught - no paper foundations. Controlling her palette is also essential.

2. Patriotic BOM: Moda Fabrics has still another star block! This one has nice big 18" blocks and could be made from charm squares.
