The ONLY good light in this room is in the morning and I don't even need to turn on a light if it is sunny. It's much more compact than before but it works...and so do I! Almost weekly I connect with you all to talk about our quilts.

My business plan did not turn out like I hoped it would, but it became a foundation for new goals and meeting new people.

I seem to like two year goals. I am loving being the president of the SJVQG. I signed on for one year and am now half way through year two! I like the planning for new projects but mostly I like connecting with people who find quilting to be as interesting and challenging a hobby as I do! I'd love to hear some of your future plans for quilts!

BOTV and SJVQG NEED VOLUNTEERS TO HELP DURING THE BOTV SHOW

BOTV is asking **SJVQG**_to provide 15 docents to perform 'white glove duty' for a 2-hour shift at the quilt show. In exchange BOV will set aside a <u>free</u> space for our guild to sell tickets for our opportunity quilt. Volunteers working a docent shift will receive a wristband for free entry that will be good for the entire day they work.

SJVQG will need 16 volunteers to sit with our opportunity quilt and sell tickets. Shifts are available in 2 hour shifts or longer. If volunteers are able to do 4 hour shifts or longer, we will only need 8 people or less. Our guild will pay for your entry fee to the show if you volunteer to sell tickets for a minimum of 2 hours.

Remember, if you personally enter a quilt in the show, you will get in free on all 3 days.

Shifts are 10am to 12pm, 12pm to 2pm and 2pm to 4pm. Sunday no docent is needed 10am-11am Sunday Shifts start 11am to 1pm and 1pm to 3pm closing.

You can sign up in pairs and work 2 hour or 4 hour shifts and then enjoy the show and shop before heading home. Please help to keep this wonderful local quilt show going. In addition, you can help our guild to increase our opportunity quilt ticket sales.

San Joaquin Valley Quilters Guild Challenge Quilt Guidelines – Pat Baker March 10, 2022

Time to get your creative juices flowing and your hands and machines sewing to prepare an entry for the March 2022 quilt challenge. We have had lots of sunshine this summer so one of the challenges will be to see just how you use this beautiful "mellow yellow" fabric.

Here are the official guidelines (and the judges will have their rulers ready)



Quilt must be no larger than 24 x 24 inches
You will receive a fat quarter of the yellow fabric and
must have at least 4 inches of the yellow fabric showing
Red fabric, mostly solid will also need at least 4 inches showing.

Must have 3 pinwheels (only 3)

Must be completed with binding

Any style of quilt making will be accepted

First Prize: \$100 Second Prize: \$75 Third Prize: \$50 Viewers' Choice.....\$25

The yellow fabric will start being available at the November guild meeting. You must be a current member of the SJVQG to participate.

Judging will be at the March 10, 2022 Meeting







Please make sure your entry is hidden in a bag or container when you submit it at the March 10th meeting.

Your name is on the quilt back and can be covered up prior to the judging.

February's block of the month is *Love Letters* to celebrate the month of love and kindness. You can fussy cut an image, embroider something, or use a pretty print of your favorite things. Please use white for the envelope and the background should be some shade of pink. Making more than one block and turning them in at the meeting increases your chance of winning a jar of honey during the drawing. The E-blast has been sent with the patterns and directions.

January's block of the month was *Star Light, Star Bright*. Irene won the jar of honey for one of the two blocks she donated. Her cupboard is now filled with honey, so although she will continue to donate blocks, she indicated she won't enter the drawing each month. That means your chance of winning improves!


Important news! In calendar year 2021, our guild made and donated **350** comfort quilts to people in our community who could really benefit from them. Recipients included wildfire refugees, dialysis patients, hospice patients, veterans, domestic violence escapees, and foster children. The quilts were received with smiles, gratitude, and appreciation. As you well know, some of the quilts were made from start to finish by a single individual, while others came from top-makers, back-piecers, batting-cutters, volunteer quilters, and binders working one after the other to yield a completed quilt.

The comfort quilt team would like to make you aware of an opportunity to be a "Volunteer Quilter for a Day." Every first Saturday of the month, John Lilly hosts what he calls "Charity Quilt Day" at his home. Starting at 10 AM, members can bring a comfort quilt top, plus back and batting, and use an APQS longarm under John's direction, to quilt it. The top may be one you've made, or you can use a quilting kit from the stash—no muss, no fuss, just donate your time while learning quilting skills for free! An appointment is not necessary, but it is a good idea to call ahead to be sure there will be machine time for you that day. Questions? Call John at 559-681-9809. Quilting kits are usually available in the stash; check with Susan Schara if there are favorite colors you'd like to work with. This is one more way to participate in our guild's donation program. FEBRUARY PROGRAM: Curved Paper Piecing/ Flying Geese, Taught by Joanie Martin





The paper piecing method we are going to learn is a free form, continuous line of flying geese. In our tutorial at the guild meeting

I will:

- -show samples of finished projects,
- -demonstrate how to draw the lines to create the curve and
- -demonstrate how to make the "geese."

By the end of the meeting you will have a pattern drawn on tracing paper that is ready to paper piece at home on your machine.

For our tutorial you will need to bring the following:

- -A pencil (and a sharpener if not mechanical)
- -An eraser (preferably not the one on the end of your pencil!)
- -A straight edge that is 6 -12" long
- -A permanent pen of your choice to mark your final pattern lines.

February Findings

1. Cathy made an interesting Kawandi style quilt. Her fabric collection continues to amaze me. She also links to an earlier post about Kawandi, and about this project.

2. Patriotic BOM: This pattern from Robert Kaufman is meant for their 2022 color of the year but would work with red-white-blue. It uses flying geese, squares and rectangles. No HSTs! Either two values of red or two of blue could be used for the star points.

3. Elizabeth's quilting bee made her some Lady Quilter blocks, based on a Freddy Moran design. And some sewing notion blocks. She has links to all the patterns, many of which came from a long-ago BOM for the Surfside Quilters.




