PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



COLOR

Color makes me happy. One of my favorite fine artists is quoted as saying, "I prefer living in color." David Hockney is a master of using color to enhance his paintings.

I am amazed by color. Today, driving home from the coast I saw a landscape of color in the complementary colors yellow and purple. Greens were used as the neutral and it was brilliant!

For three days I observed the blue hues of my vista as they changed. Day 1 rain clouds shrouded the ocean and allowed the sun to peak through in little bits. The sky and ocean colors were shades of gray with blue hues. Day 2 was clear but very windy. The ocean was a deep blue with bits of white as the white caps marched to the shore. Day 3 the air was still. Ripples of swells drove over the ocean but I could see different blue hues as the sun reflected off the ocean floor.

Yesterday, we drove through the foothills on the still sunny day. It was about 3 pm so the shadows were beginning to show under the oak trees. I tried to make a little view finder with the hands to focus on one area of green. I stopped counting at 30 different shades of green!

I was inspired by my color-saturated stay at the coast to look at my quilt projects through this "three-day lens". I dug out a series of rainbow colors I bought a couple of years ago and began planning how I will use them in a quilt. And I'm looking at a quilt I pieced and am quilting that is shades of blue-like Day 1! My curved paper pieced geese are cool shades of blue and green. And I had just finished this baby quilt (above) for a friend's daughter who also loves color!

Spring in our valley is full of color. I encourage you to take time to see it and enjoy it!

I'm looking forward to our QUILT CHALLENGE meeting next month! We are a very creative group!

COMFORT QUILT NEWS – Susan Schara

Our guild stash is an amazing resource for members to use in myriad ways to make items for our donation program. Bins of (quarter-yard minimum) pieces of fabric sorted by color are available for pieced tops or, less often, appliqued ones. There are panels, also, to spark creativity and provide a head start for quilt-making. There are themed collections, too, such as Hearts, Stripes, Christmas, Paisleys, Patriotic, Kids, or Florals. Kits for toiletry/accessory bags include fabrics and coordinating zippers for times when you're in the mood for a small yet useful project. Bins full of backing fabrics are also organized by color, and sometimes yield whole-cloth tops as well. Whether a quilt was made from your own fabric or stash fabric, our Hobbs 80/20 batting will be cut to order and provided to you at no charge for use in donation items. You may of course quilt comfort quilts yourself, but volunteer quilters will quilt donation items on their long arm or domestic machines, again for free. And the final step, binding, can be accomplished by someone who loves to do it, if you don't.

The comfort quilt team aims to promote the making of quilts for donation to agencies in our community. We want to provide easy access to fabric resources and human resources so guild members can collaborate by engaging in the quilt-making processes they enjoy the most. Remember, the stash is open 24/7 and the Stash Mistress is happy to help visitors find what they need when they stop by. See you soon at the stash or our next In-person meeting!

March Findings

1. I like the rick-rack look of this quilt, which is a good way to use up 2.5" wide scraps. She makes 2" x 8" finished units. (Blocklets?) Her layout eliminates much of the point-matching.

2. Patriotic BOM: Hope you don't say, "Dang! I'm tired of stars!" The Twinkle Star is based on a nine-patch grid. It helps to have a Tri-Recs ruler set. Mari made these 9" blocks:

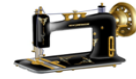

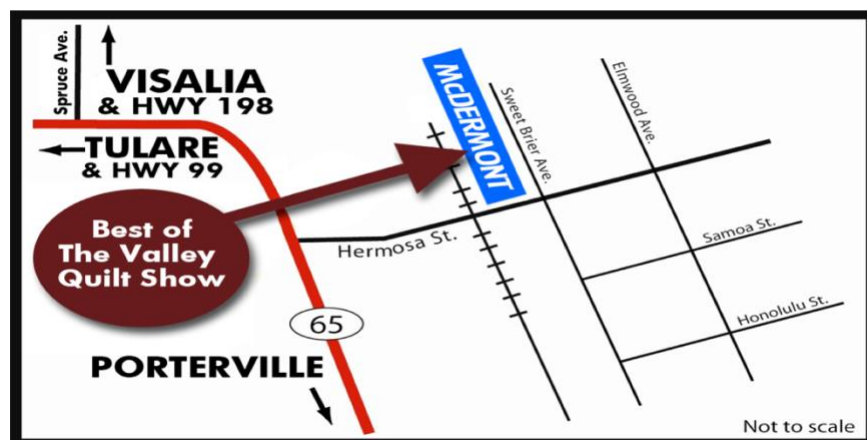
