PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



Memories from Guatemala and the Guild

July 9th to the 16th my husband and I had the opportunity to serve with a medical mission team to Guatemala with an organization called Faith in Practice.

blog. <https://www.faithinpractice.org/blog/category/713/>) He is a physician and I am an educator. He knew what his job was going to be and my job was in limbo.

On Sunday we headed on a five hour bus ride to set up our first clinic site. I was assigned to the pharmacy with four other more competent women than myself.

The following morning we headed back on the bus to our clinic site. My first picture shows our patients waiting in line to see our doctors and receive medication. In our first our clinic days we treated 651 people! And most of them received prescriptions from our pharmacy!

Tuesday afternoon we took down our clinic and Wednesday morning we set up our clinic again! The second picture was the site of this clinic. Both clinics were in an elementary school. This school was filled with lush tropical plants like this one. We were there Wednesday and Thursday and saw 612 patients!

The third picture is of the pharmacy team: an experienced pharmacist, a Dutch immigrant who has chosen to make Guatemala her home and works for Faith in Practice, a college student who wants to make volunteering her career, an experienced veterinarian who has been coming to Guatemala for years and a 70 year old teacher! We made a great team!

I love to quilt, to create, cook and hang out with my family and with quilters, like you! But every once in a while I get an opportunity to enter another's world. My horizons have been expanded. I am so thankful for this opportunity to serve in Guatemala AND as your president.

This is my last letter as your president. I have been serving as president since September 2020, at the height of the COVID lockdown! We are still here, which means we can survive as a guild even though we can't meet in person! You have been gracious as we implemented new procedures to meet in person. (like four to a table and masking up.)

My thanks to all of you and to the women who have served as my board. Your hard work has not gone unnoticed!

I'm looking forward to a new year!

Applique by **Pat Rosander**, Pieced and quilted by **Sandy Clark**.

This beautiful quilt has a white and cream background with an appliqued grape motif of purple with green vines and leaves. The quilting is exquisite with intricate designs enhancing the grape motif with trapunto. Rouleau loops adorn the border along with feathers. Sandy reports that she enjoyed completing the custom trapunto sections, using two layers of wool to create the lovely relief. Champagne colored thread was used to enhance the shadowing of the trapunto. The quilt measures 70" x 71" and will be displayed to the public for the first time on **September 20 at the Central CA Women's Conference**. Tickets for the April 2023 raffle will be on sale, beginning at the Women's Conference and continuing at the Fresno Fair.

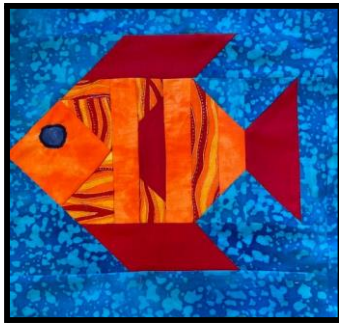

Pillowcase 101

Fabric required:

$\frac{3}{4}$ yard for body of pillowcase

$\frac{1}{4}$ to $\frac{1}{3}$ yard for cuff/hem of pillowcase

$\frac{1}{8}$ yard (actually, 2" to 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ ") for accent strip

Cut body: 27" x WOF (40"-42") Cut accent strip: 2 $\frac{1}{2}$"-3" x WOF Cut cuff: 9" x WOF
--

1. Lay cuff/hem fabric right side up with selvages (short sides) on right and left.
2. Press accent strip in half lengthwise, wrong sides together, and place along top edge of cuff fabric with raw edges even.
3. Lay main pillowcase fabric face down on top of cuff and accent strip, again making sure that top edges are even.
4. Roll bottom edge of main fabric toward cuff so that bottom half of cuff shows.
5. Bring bottom edge of cuff up to meet raw edges at top, pin.
6. Stitch $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam. Reaching inside the resulting fabric tube, pull main pillowcase fabric out, press.
7. Trim off uneven selvage edges on each side. Pin pillowcase right side out, matching cuff, accent strip, and main pillowcase edges. Stitch scant $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam along the remaining raw edges (alongside and bottom of pillowcase). Carefully trim seam to about $\frac{1}{8}$ " for about an inch or so at the thickest part of seam, where cuff, accent and main fabric meet.
8. Turn inside out and press. Now sew again alongside and bottom of pillowcase, using a generous $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam to enclose previous raw edges.
9. Turn right side out and press one last time. Voila!

Helpful Hints

If design on fabric is on the lengthwise grain (parallel to selvages), it will run horizontally on finished pillowcase. If design is perpendicular to selvages (across width of fabric), it will appear vertical on finished pillowcase. To "audition" fabric, look at it with selvages running crosswise in front of you. If design does not go in desired direction, buy 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ yards of fabric, cut a 27" piece lengthwise from it. Use according to directions above but ignore references to "selvage".

When making a flannel pillowcase, sew final seam (8) $\frac{1}{2}$ " or even $\frac{5}{8}$ " to better enclose previous seam and make final seam more flexible. To make pillowcase for a 12"x16" baby/travel pillow, cut the following" Cuff 27"x7 $\frac{1}{2}$ ", Accent 27"x2", Body 27"x18"
