FABRIC REQUIREMENTS

BEAK- orange/gold

A= 1 3/4" X 1 3/4"

BODY- Any Color you want

E 1 @ 2 1/8" X 2 1/8"

F 1 @ 1 1/8" X 1 3/4"

G 1 @ 2 3/8" X 2 5/8"

I 2 @ 2 5/8" X 2 5/8"

J 1 @ 5 7/8" X 8"

BACKGROUND - WHITE

B 1 @ 1 3/4" X 3"

C 1 @ 8" X 3"

D 1 @ 2 1/8" X 2 1/8"

H 1 @ 3 7/8" X 6 1/8"

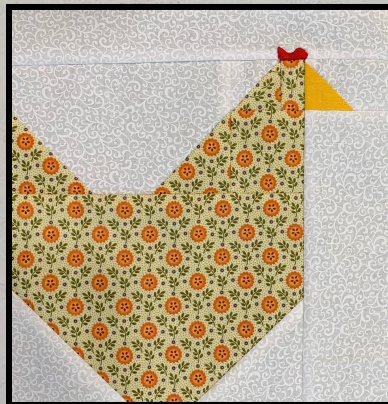
K 2 @ 3 3/8" X 3 3/8"

L 1 @ 1 3/4" X 10 1/2"

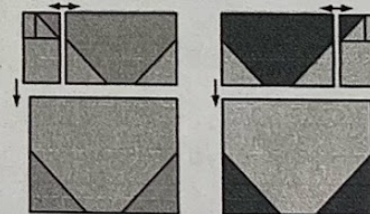
Finishing

Before attaching L to the top of the block, the chicken can have a small piece of red rick rack tacked to the seam line before sewing the seam.

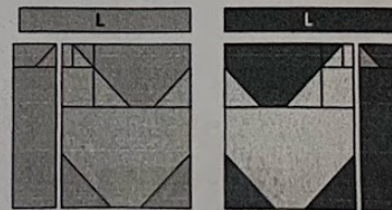
Steps 8 & 9



8 Sew the step 6 H/I unit to one side of the step 5 HST unit as shown. Press. Sew the step 7 K/J unit to the lower edge. Press the seam allowances toward the K/J unit.



9 Sew the step 4 A/B/C unit to one side of the step 8 unit. Press the seam allowances toward the A/B/C unit. Sew one long edge of the L rectangle to the upper edge to complete the block. Press. The block should measure 10 1/2" x 10 1/2". Make a total of 20 Chicken Blocks.

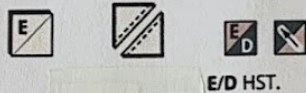


FLOCK PARTY QUILT PATTERN

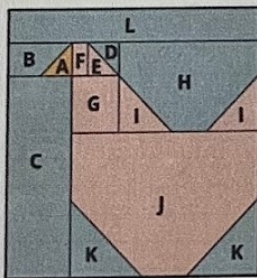
Note: All seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise specified. Press seam allowances open unless otherwise indicated.

Make the Blocks

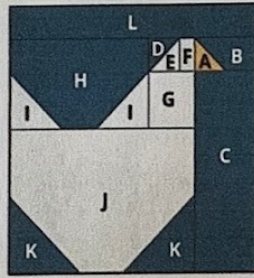
1 Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of each E square. Referring to the quilt photo for fabric combinations, place one marked E square right sides together with one D square, matching outer edges. Sew 1/4" away from each side of the marked line. Cut along the marked line and press the seam allowances toward the darker fabric. Trim and square HST (half-square triangle) to 1 3/4" x 1 3/4".



2 Referring to the quilt photo for fabric combinations and chicken orientation, organize the cut pieces for each block. Each block requires one E/D HST, one A square, six matching background pieces (one each of B, C, H, and L, plus two K), and five matching chicken pieces (one each of F, G, and J, plus two I).

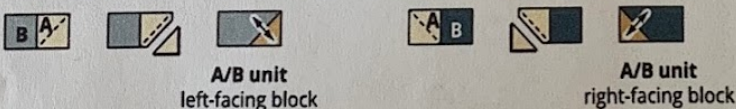


Left-facing Chicken Block

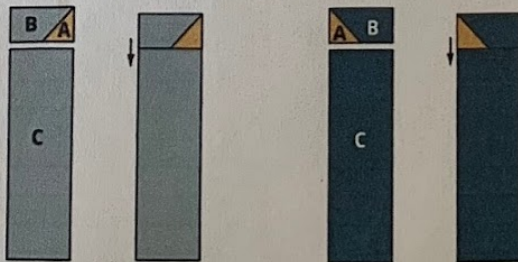


Right-facing Chicken Block

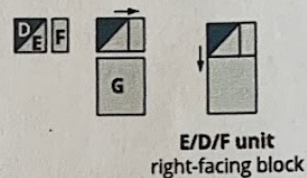
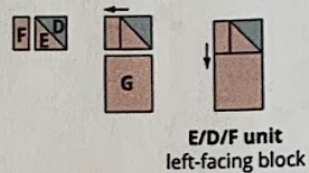
3 Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of the A square. Noting the orientation of the marked line, place the A square right sides together on the right end (for a left-facing chicken) or left end (for a right-facing chicken) of the B rectangle. Sew along the marked line and trim the excess corner fabric, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance. Press the triangle open.



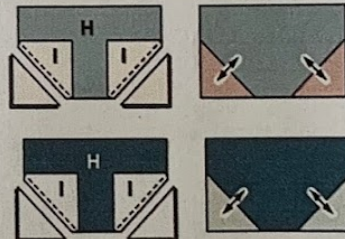
4 Sew one short end of the C rectangle to the lower edge of the A/B unit. Press the seam allowances toward the rectangle.



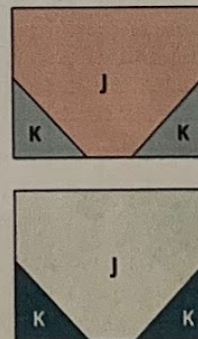
5 Noting orientation, sew the F rectangle to one side of HST. Press the seam allowances toward the rectangle. Sew the G rectangle to the lower edge of the unit. Press the seam allowances toward the G rectangle.



6 Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of the two I squares. Noting the orientation of the marked lines, place one I square right sides together in each lower corner of the H rectangle, as shown. Sew along the marked line and trim the excess corner fabric, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance. Press the triangles open.



7 Repeat step 6, using the K squares and J rectangle.



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
