# SJVQG Opportunity Quilt 2022-2023



Applique by Pat Rosander, Pieced and quilted by Sandy Clark.

This beautiful quilt has a white and cream background with an appliqued grape motif of purple with green vines and leaves. The quilting is exquisite with intricate designs enhancing the grape motif with trapunto. Rouleau loops adorn the border along with feathers. Sandy reports that she enjoyed completing the custom trapunto sections, using two layers of wool to create the lovely relief. Champagne colored thread was used to enhance the shadowing of the trapunto. The quilt measures 70" x 71" and was displayed to the public for the first time on **September 20 at the Central CA Women's Conference**. Tickets for the April 2023 raffle are now on sale.

### **DOTTIE'S FINDINGS – Dottie Daybell**

Findings March 2023

1. This is months early for a Christmas project, but I might forget if I don't post it now! Louise tells us about her placemats, with their interesting color scheme. I especially like her adaptation of a wreath pattern where she filled in the center. The wreath is simpler than it looks, with ten FPP wedges.

2. Patriotic BOM: Another very nice star block!

There's no exact pattern, but it uses simple units in a 5-patch grid to make a 10" or 15" block: squares, HSTs and Triangle-in-a-Square. I like the Tri-Recs ruler for those last units. Make your units 2.5" finished for a 10" block, 3.5" for a 15-inch block.

3. Cathy found a pattern for pieced boys and girls, and improved it. She's using the blocks for this year's Rainbow Scrap Challenge.

4. I like the various ways Elaine enlarged these blocks, instead of just adding plain strips all around. Some of them used more of the same fabrics, but they'd probably work with scrappier additions, too.
