San Joaquin Valley Quilters' Guild 2023-2024 Budget

INCOME

Membership Calculated at 100 members@\$35.

<u>Grants</u> – We cannot guarantee that we will get another grant from the Women's conference but Cathy Armstrong will be putting a lot of effort into Grants for our organization and request additional funds from the Women's Conference. This money will help us pay for the extra costs of our community service projects.

Opportunity Quilt 2023-24— We made \$3,647 on the last quilt and project that we will increase the sales even more to at least \$3,700. We will have the availability of Venmo/Square for the Women's Conference. The annual quilt drawing has been extended a month to May. This extension allows for tickets to be sold at Best of the Valley in April. Tickets will also be available at our Quilt Show in April. The quilt will visit neighboring quilt Guilds(Kings River, Orange Blossom, Valley Oaks, etc) to sell tickets. Quilt Show—We are planning a small quilt show for April 6-Details will be provided later. Income will be generated from admission(300@\$10), basket raffles(\$450) and vendor space rental(10 vendors @\$50.

OTHER INCOME-WIP@\$100, Bank interest@\$7, Ads@\$480, Workshops/Last Chance,

Auctions@ \$300 =round to \$990

Newsletter Ads—We currently have 1 ad with a potential for an additional 6. We are projecting 4 ads @ \$120 a year which calculates to \$10 a month for a full page ad. Income to us @ \$480.

<u>Workshops/Last Chance Auction</u>—There will be some workshops but member costs are usually based on presenter's fees with no additional increase in income to the Guild. Another Last Chance Auction will be included in the coming year. We made \$300 at the last one.

EXPENSES

NO SIGNIFICANT CHANGES EXPENSES: PROGRAMS, OPPORTUNITY QUILT 2023-24, PO BOX RENTAL, CHALLENGE PRIZES & JUDGE

<u>Comfort quilts & other projects</u>—This budget is being doubled because of the additional quilts we are making and the increase in batting costs. We also have costs for fleece for chemo hats and webbing. <u>Guild Insurance costs</u>—The cost of this increased to \$4 a person last fiscal year.

<u>Meeting Facility Rent</u>—rent increases \$25/month starting in January 2024. This will be the first increase in many years.

Road trips—Income/expenses will be equal or close. There is no profit and there should be little or no unaccounted costs.

<u>Technology/zoom, misc expenses</u>—This is a necessary non negotiable cost for our organization. We have to have technology to keep in contact, send newsletters, E Blasts, a website & Facebook.

<u>Scholarship</u>—We have reinstated a \$1,000 scholarship. The qualifications for applicants/organizations have not been determined yet. A committee will be established to advertise the availability, prepare the application form, review the applicants and present to the Board for final approval.

Quilt Show Expenses—Projected quilt show expenses will be a donation to the church for use of the space and other minimal costs.

Storage Unit—We are planning to downsize from a 5X14 unit to a 5X10 before year end which will cost under \$640 annually instead of \$918 for the current.

Other Expenses—Webbing@\$150, President quilt@\$100, printer/paper@\$235, membership supplies@\$50, Dues to NO. & SO. Guilds@\$80, Hospitality@\$100, Tax/license @ \$45=\$760



DOTTIE'S FINDINGS – Dottie Daybell

Findings August 2023

1. An interview with modern quilter Charles Cameron. I like his Tilted Tiles pattern, which is only available to Modern Quilt Guild members. See Finding #3 below for the site that led me to this interview:

2. Patriotic BOM: Alycia made two QOV quilts from blocks made 5 years ago. There's no pattern, but she used 9" finished wonky stars and strips cut 2.5" x 9.5". Easy and effective, although I'd probably use strait-laced stars, and perhaps several different star designs.

3. Mary at Zippy Quilts posts about quilts she's made for Ronald McDonald House, including a Tilted Tiles quilt, one with Hatchet blcks, HSTs and Squares, and more. I loved her comment about donation quilts: "My husband said, 'Those are some really nice quilts you're giving away. 'Yes, they are; I do not make quick versions of quilts for donation, nor do any of the people with whom I work on donation quilts.'"




