DOTTIE'S FINDINGS – Dottie Daybell

Findings November 2023

1. Debbie in Seattle discusses her two-sided challenge quilt. My favorite is side two, which represents her feelings about the pandemic. I think it's just right! She started with a slab of diagonal lines slanting together, and then just cut it vertically about 2/3 of the way across, an rotated the smaller piece to form the right side.

2. Patriotic BOM: Linda shows us a QOV that would be good for larger scale patriotic prints. It's easier than it looks, done with strip piecing. Linda set the blocks differently from the pattern. She says the free pattern is "Borneo Lights", but it's "Borneo Nights". I found another website with a link to download the pattern from Google Drive.

The blocks are often rectangular. Her designs are her own, and her instructions are good. She first started the series while downsizing for a move, when she had many prints to use up. 


