The winners for our book and fabric raffle were: Books – Elena Ortiz and Carolee Clayton, Fabric – Elena Ortiz.



At our December meeting, we received completed quilts from Jeanne Starks/Pamela Alexander, Karen Coy, and Jan Kinney (3). Kathryn Miller brought in 2 top/back packets, and Teresa Orr contributed a block collection.

We were able to deliver 12 comfort quilts to the Marjaree Mason shelter program, 11 to Bristol Hospice, and 9 comfort quilts to DaVita dialysis centers. Over the course of 2023 we produced a total of 224 quilts for our community recipients. Our quilt totals have gradually declined from the 450 or more of 2020, due in part to our making a variety of donation items now, not just quilts.

The holidays are behind us, and what we used to think of as "next year" is NOW! Have you made any resolutions for 2024? Consider ways to be a more productive quilter, whether through learning new techniques or having some consistent guaranteed sewing time in your life. Consider ways to be a more active participant in the guild by assisting with the various activities at meetings and behind the scenes. Consider visiting the stash to become inspired by the panels, orphan blocks, and other "quilt starters" available there. We have an open door policy and would love to provide you with all you need to exercise your creativity.

DOTTIE'S FINDINGS – Dottie Daybell

Findings December 2023

1. Mary posted an interesting donation guilt she guilted for Linda.

I couldn't track down an identical pattern. The blocks with the white strips are called "waffle stamp" blocks, and the earliest post I could find was Nann's in 2013, whose quilt is made from only waffle stamp blocks:

Nann's quilt has 5" finished blocks made from 1.5" squares. I like Linda's better. The solid squares and a few 25-patch blocks, alternating with the waffle stamp blocks, make it less busy. I'd double Nann's numbers and use 2.5" strips for the postage stamps, 2.5" x 10.5" strips of white, and 10.5" cut solid squares. Nann pieced a strata of five strips and cut them crosswise to make the rows of "stamps".

2. Patriotic BOM: Back in May, Carol posted instructions for a number of red, white and blue 12" blocks. She links to a video, as well. From this link, you can use the Newer Post and Older Post links to see other blocks:

3. Krista Moser posted instructions for making a sunflower block using her ruler. (You might be able to get along with a 60-degree triangle ruler, if you were careful.

4. Gladi, after showing us a couple of her wonderful WIPs, shares photos from a Maine Quilt Show exhibit of applique quilts by Hortense Beck, which are now owned by the International Quilt Museum.


