PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE MARCH 2024

Good afternoon Quilters,

Today, I am going to address the elephant in the room first. Our guest artist program via computer and Zoom has been in operation for approximately four years. During that time, we have seen, listened to and learned from many quilt artists via the Zoom platform without a problem. It is my understanding that at our February meeting our good luck ran out and there were some unexpected problems with the computer connection and the presentation by the guest artist. Since that time, our diligent Vice President, Program Chairperson and our Webmistress have been working on a solution and have met with Hope Church to try to solve the problem. At our March meeting we will be doing some things differently than we have previously. Please listen carefully to our solution, then cooperate and support those who are doing their best to take care of the technical issues that make all of our lives a little easier. Be kind.

At the March 7 meeting the doors to the Community Center, our regular meeting room, will open at 6:30. We ask that you come in at that time, set down your Show & Tell, turn in your Block of the Month, etc. At 7:00, I will welcome everyone and present the following plan for the evening. At approximately 7:10 we will walk through a connecting door to the Conference Center. The technology set up in the Conference Center will serve us better for Zoom presentations with enhanced audio and video. You will only take your purse with you, leaving all else behind at your table. Our Hospitality Chairperson, Grace Robinson-Whipple will remain in the Community Center to greet any latecomers and join the meeting via Zoom on a laptop at one of the tables. At the conclusion of our guest speaker's presentation, we will end the Zoom call, and return to the Community Center, where we will take a short break, and conclude the remainder of our meeting there.

Hope Lutheran is offering the use of two rooms for our General Meeting at no extra charge. They have almost completed technology upgrades in the Adult Meeting Center, the room adjacent to the Conference Center, and this space will have even better equipment and space to serve our needs. We anticipate moving to that room for Guest Speakers via Zoom when construction is completed.

In summary:

- Meeting called to order at 7:00, brief welcome with explanation of the plan for the evening
- Simultaneously at 7:00 the Zoom meeting will begin in the Conference Center, admitting in our members joining us remotely

- Hospitality will remain in the Community Center to direct any members and watch from a laptop at a table
- At the conclusion of the speaker's presentation, we will say goodbye to members joining us remotely and we will walk back down the hall to the Community Center for the remainder of our meeting.

Now, for something more fun. How many of you have finished quilts that you are planning to include in our upcoming show? Have you filled out your application and attached a photo? Joanie, Nancy and Diane are looking forward to receiving all your applications with all your beautiful quilt photos attached. Our March meeting is a "must deliver" on quilt show information. Let's be responsible and help our quilt show team. How many quilts have you finished? Joanie asked for 100. I think we can do better than that!

My last reminder is about the Last Chance Auction. Did you remember that it's coming up very soon, and that we have guidelines for presenting your "stuff"? The Guidelines List is included in this newsletter. Please read it carefully and follow the rules. When you do this, it makes it much easier for those setting up the tables and distributing the tickets. Please help us to have another successful Auction.

Today's message clearly shows that my mind is very busy thinking about the many events coming up. All these events make us a very busy guild. If you have not found your special group, jump in and join us. We can always use another person with time, talent and the skills to make a quilt, stitch a duffle bag, a Dream Bag, or an accessory bag, or even a small project like a chemo cap. Take the time to ask someone who looks busy. They will have an answer for you or point you in the right direction.

Dear Crafter/Vendor:

We welcome you to participate in our Springtime in the Valley Quilt Show. First, we would like to thank those vendors that have participated in our previous quilt show and invite other vendors to be a participant this year. Our quilt show has been an increasingly successful event with large crowds attending. We could not have done it without you, our vendors.

The Quilt show is scheduled on Sat April 6th, 2024, 8:30 am to 3:30 pm. The location is First Presbyterian Church located at 1540 M Street, Fresno, CA. The cost will be \$50.

We are looking for a diversity of handmade unique high-quality crafts and art pieces. The number of crafters/artist booths with the same type of sale items will be limited. Due to liability issues and Health Department requirements, food vendor's applications will not be considered.

The Guild requires that each vendor donate one item upon their arrival for use in our Raffle Drawing. Please provide a description of the item and attach your business card. This will help advertise your wares and create interest in the vendors. It should be something from your typical inventory and reflect the type of merchandise you offer for sale.

This is a community wide event. Advertising and promotion to the public will be through print, TV, radio, social media and at local quilters/fabric shops. In addition, feel free to advertise that your business will be open during the Quilt show. We encourage you to invite your family and friends to this event.

SPRINGTIME IN THE VALLEY QUILT SHOW 2024

Our quilt show is coming up soon! Information about the show and Arthop were given at the meeting on January 11th. Submission forms for quilts were given out at the meeting and are also available on our website (Click here for the form) and in this newsletter. We will exhibit about 120 quilts and about 30 table runners. Start making up your mind which quilts you want to enter! Here's what you need to know about submissions:

- 1. Your quilt cannot be longer than 72"
- 2. Your quilt does not have to be made in the last calendar year. This is because we have not had a quilt show in several years!
- 3. You may submit 2 quilts and 1 table runner for the show. One quilt can be a fabric jacket if you would like. **Registration Entry Deadline has been extended to March 7th.** Dates for when you'll drop off quilts will be given at a later date

Our guild will also be hosting **Arthop on Thursday, April 4, 2024, from 5 pm to 8 pm**, two days prior to our quilt show. **We are looking for TABLE RUNNERS for this show.** Again, they do not have to be completed in the last calendar year. Use a *third* submission form to submit your piece. Our **Arthop exhibit** will be included as part of our quilt show. **Please note**: The table runner is not part of the two quilt submission limit for the show.

The co-chairs for the quilt show are **Joanie Martin (imjogg@pacbell.net)** and **Nancy Christian (nancythequilter@aol.com)**. Help is needed to:

- sell tickets at the door, stamp paid entrants hand, and monitor the doors
- hospitality for vendors
- set up on Friday afternoon, April 5th
- sell tickets at the show for the raffle baskets
- spread the word to shops/vendors (See Vendor Information page from Nancy Christian
- We have cards to advertise the quilt show and they can be picked up at the meeting. Give them to your family and friends. Also leave them at any guilt store you visit.

LAST CHANCE AUCTION GUIDELINES MAY 9th Program

These Guidelines are intended for the use of the Last Chance Auction in order to provide the members with a smoother, more efficient auction. Please carefully follow them as written. Thank you.

- 1. All items must be clean and bagged.
- 2. Group like items together, i.e. rulers, threads, fat quarters.
- 3. Hardbound books must be grouped and tied together.
- 4. Absolutely NO Magazines.
- 5. Machines must be clearly marked. If missing vital parts, state clearly.
- 6. All fabric must be marked. No loose fabrics.
 - 6a. Scraps must be bagged and tagged, i.e. scraps, strips, squares, fat quarters
 - 6b. Yardage over 1/2 yard must be tied and tagged.
- 7. All yarn must be bagged and tagged
- 8. All needles must be bagged or taped together..
- 9. All thread must be bagged and tagged.
- 10.All notions must be in good condition and bagged and tagged.
- 11. All projects must be clearly labeled and bagged.

Members must provide bags and tags for their items. Items must be brought <u>Bagged and Tagged</u> ready for the tables.

PHOTOS OF COMFORT QUILTS ARE POSTED THROUGHOUT THE NEWSLETTER EACH MONTH.

At our February meeting, we received comfort quilts from Jan Kinney (2), Sharon Weber, and Janet DeJong. Quilt tops came from Carol Mills-Henry, Elena Ortiz, and Lois Light (6). Dee Mooneyham provided 2 quilts ready for binding plus one top/back pair. Janet DeJong also gave 2 quilts ready for binding. Additional quilts came from Fanchon, our faithful binder. Overall we had 17 quilts ready for delivery and were able to bring 4 quilts to Bristol Hospice, 7 to the Marjaree Mason Shelter Program, and 6 to DaVita dialysis centers. Nice work, everyone!

After signing in on meeting nights, remember to look at the comfort quilts displayed for your enjoyment on the long tables at the front of the room. You will see simple to complex piecing and block layouts, every color of fabric, even surface embellishment and applique at various times. Quilting ranges from straight line designs produced with domestic machines to hand-guided or computer-controlled long-arm work. You will rarely, if ever, see two quilts alike. Our donation quilts can be elegant, child-like, dramatic, serene, traditional, modern, bright...the list goes on. Our quilts reflect our varied skills, preferences and personalities, and demonstrate our compassion for the recipient agencies in our community.







DOTTIE'S FINDINGS – Dottie Daybell

March 2024 Findings

1. Deb and friends tested various needle threaders. I still use a threader that's probably 40 years old the type she calls "foil". I had no idea there were so many different types.

2. Patriotic BOM: I'm challenging you with this star pattern, which requires partial seams (but not Y-seams). And it requires buying a used book! But it's so interesting! First link is Julie's post about how the block is constructed, and the second shows her finished top, made for the Rainbow Scrap Challenge:

3. Valerie does interesting tumbler quilts, scrappy but organized.

4. Wanda is the queen of colorwash quilts, usually making them with batik squares or Kaffe prints. I really like her series of "Crooked Cobblestone" quilts, made instead with framed rectangle blocks in many sizes. They are sewn in vertical rows of the same width blocks, but the width of each row varies. She's working on #13 right now. Here are all her blog posts with the keyword "cobblestone series". They're in reverse chronological order, so you might want to start at the end and work back up. And use the "Older Posts" or "Newer Posts" links at the bottom.

MEMBER INFORMATION

- SIGN-IN AT THE MEETINGS. It helps us to know how many members are attending each month.
- WEAR A NAME TAG at the meetings. Helps us remember names.
- SAVE THE HOBBS UPC CODES from any Hobbs package or batting purchases, no matter how small.






