PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE MAY, 2024

Greetings Quilters,

It's a beautiful day with sunshine and clear skies. A great day for working in my yard but I don't think that's what I will do today. I'm getting ready for the *Last Chance Auction*. My son and daughter are both encouraging me to "get rid of all that stuff". Can you imagine all those beautiful fabrics and threads being called "stuff"? And, there are patterns and yarn and stuffing for toys. Lots of books, both hardbound and soft bound, but no magazines! I'm reviewing the rules listed in the newsletter (thank you Irene) and packaging everything with labels. Hopefully, it will make your choices easier, and Tom and Beth will be happier. I eliminated some things, as well.

How are you doing? Are you going through your stash and pulling out those fabrics that you just had to have? You know, the ones you never used because they weren't the right color or the pattern just didn't fit with any of your other fabrics. What about all those spools of thread? Are they usable? Have they been sitting in that box for many years, 5, 10,15 or 20? Thread does get old and the fibers do break down. Maybe that's something you want to check out while you're resizing your stash. How about the embroidery threads? Have you noticed that the colors aren't as vibrant as when you purchased them? You might check out the state of your needles while you're checking out your threads. Good needles last a long time. However, they do get bent as we use them and when they are not stored properly, may become rusty. Do you have a yarn stash along with your fabric and threads? The same things apply to yarn as to thread. Time and moisture and dust are the enemies of all fibers.

Now, I'm thinking about tools. How many rulers do you have? Do you use all of them? How often do you use that 60-degree triangle? What about that special *Twirler* kit? How many quilts did you make with that one? Are you ready to make another quilt like that? I am finding things I didn't even know I had and wondering where did that come from? This is our golden opportunity to downsize, resize, reshape and just get rid of all those extras that we don't need and don't use any more. Join me in reshaping our quilting lives. Let's have the biggest and best *Last Chance Auction* we have ever had! See you soon.

REVIEW THE GUIDELINES BELOW(come early if in doubt) Please come prepared as follows:

These Guidelines are intended for the use of the Last Chance Auction in order to provide the members with a smoother, more efficient auction. Please carefully follow them as written.

- 1. All items must be clean and bagged.
- 2. Group like items together, i.e. rulers, threads, fat quarters.
- 3. Hardbound books must be grouped and tied together.
- 4. Absolutely NO Magazines.
- 5. Machines must be clearly marked. If missing vital parts, state clearly.
- 6. All fabric must be marked. No loose fabrics.
 - 6a. Scraps must be bagged and tagged, i.e. scraps, strips, squares, fat quarters.
 - 6b. Yardage over 1/2 yard must be tied and tagged.
- 7. All yarn must be bagged and tagged.
- 8. All needles must be bagged or taped together.
- 9. All thread must be bagged and tagged.
- 10. All notions must be in good condition and bagged/tagged.
- 11. All projects must be clearly labeled and bagged. Items must be brought Bagged/Tagged ready for the tables. We will number them upon receipt.

There will be a table outside our building to fix items that do not fit the GUIDELINES.

AUCTION PROCEDURES-PLEASE NO EARLY BIRD SHOPPING, WE'LL BE READY FOR YOU AS SOON AS WE

CAN! All items will be put on tables, bagged and numbered by the committee. **Each item, even if a duplicate, will have its own number on it and a corresponding numbered bag**. The tables will all be numbered. Drop your ticket in the bag associated with the item you want.

When it is time to draw the winning ticket for each item, they will be drawn by table numbers. All items on the first table will be called off with the winning names and the tickets taped to the item. We will stop and advise people whose names were called to come get their items. In order to keep the auction area clear, you will have **5 minutes** to retrieve your items. After 5 minutes that table is closed and we go on to table 2 and repeat the process. When table 2 is open to get items, you can finish getting items from table 1 if not cleared. Then on to table 3 and so on. If during the 5 minutes each table is not cleared please wait till the end when all names have been called.

CONSIDER HAVING PAPER AND PEN TO TRACK YOUR WINNING PURCHASES, BY NOTING THE TABLE AND NUMBER OF ITEMS FROM THAT TABLE.

There will be no runners delivering items. Please be courteous of others when picking up your items. You can assign a proxy to retrieve your items, and there will be overseers to assist.

These procedures will be orally repeated at the meeting but try to familiarize yourself ahead of time.

CRAYON QUILT CHALLENGE 2024 - Joanie Martin

Here we go again! Our quilt challenge for this year involves:

- -Choose two Crayola crayons from the jar.
- -Your quilt parameter can be no more than 96" (i.e. 24" wide x 24" long = 96", 14" Wide x 34" long = 96")
- -Your challenge must be quilted and finished.
- -You may add ONE other color to your piece.

This is a **3-COLOR quilt**, not a **3-FABRIC quilt**, so you can put as many different fabrics in it as you want as long as they are from the selected **colors**. Your challenge quilt must reflect those colors and must stay true to the colors chosen. You will be able to use any hue from light to dark in your selected colors with the addition of one color.

Using the color(s) you select, your challenge is to create a quilted item using only those colors. You can use any pattern or design.

We will celebrate the finished challenge quilts at our meeting on June 13th.

If you are wondering what to do with your challenge quilt once you are done why not donate it to the guild. If you make your piece $24'' \times 24''$ we'll use them to decorate the center of our tables for the meetings!

Quilted Postcard News from Carolee Clayton



Many of you may not know that we started a Quilted Postcard Project. It grew from the board members to Coffee Chat and we made enough cards in time for our Quilt Show to make \$470 for the guild. We've decided to prepare for sales at the Women's Conference in Sept, with any leftover inventory from that to be offered at the Fair. LEARN NEW SEWING TECHNIQUES –GET HELP ON A PROJECT— ENJOY CHATTING WITH OTHER QUILTERS



Last month our donation program received support from some wonderful donations. Jan Kinney brought a patriotic quilt made from an unusually large printed panel. Teresa Orr gave 5 comfort quilt tops and Janet Nuxoll brought a top/back kit. Dee Mooneyham turned in two quilts ready for binding. Beverly Kuykendall turned in 7 of the 3-yard quilts, so appropriate for use at dialysis centers. And an anonymous donor brought in a beautifully-made top as well as a top/back pair. The only down side was 30 straight pins inserted here and there in the quilt top, an unpleasant surprise when handling that donation. We welcome those quilt components but wish members would use safety pins when needing to keep various parts of donated comfort quilt tops or backs together.

Thanks to members' generosity, we were able to give 5 children's quilts to the Marjaree Mason Shelter Program, 4 quilts to Bristol Hospice, and 13 comfort quilts to DaVita Dialysis Centers. 


