Greetings Quilters,

Like a lot of us, I have been sewing and crafting for many years and the spectrum of unfinished projects represents nearly all areas of working with fiber. I have embroidery, needlepoint, weaving, dyeing, knitting and crocheting, felting, and sewing. I have the tools and equipment to support all of these. I began sewing my own clothing as a teenager, then sewing clothing for my children and then quilting. During this time, the other fiber related crafts were in addition to my sewing. In other words, I have a lot of *stuff*!

Now, what am I to do with all this? Do I have a yard sale? (ugh!) Do I pack it up and take it to a recycle store? Do I ask my friends if they want it? Do they know someone else who would want it? We were able to deliver 2 quilts to Kases for Kids, 10 to the Marjaree Mason Shelter Program, 6 to Bristol Hospice, and 5 quilts to DaVita Dialysis Centers. Thanks, everyone, for making these gifts possible.

News Flash! For the first time ever, we now have an Apprentice Stash Mistress! Newish member **Janetta Gibson**, who lives around the corner from the stash, expressed her desire to do something helpful for the Comfort Quilt team. We put her through a rigorous training program including a practicum, in which she was required to select back and binding fabrics for donated tops. She aced the qualifying exam with the highest score ever attained! And left with a top and fabric to work on at home. Welcome, Janetta! We are excited to have you available for our monthly work sessions and know we can benefit from your energy and creativity.

MEMBERSHIP – Shannon Mueller

After many years without an increase, the Board is recommending dues be raised to \$40 per year. Our costs for insurance and meeting space alone justify the increase, but many other expenses related to Guild activities are on the rise. We adjusted our budget to trim costs wherever possible, are reducing the size of our storage rental, and apply for grants based on our active community service to supplement our income, but an increase in annual dues is still deemed necessary. The complete 2024-2025 budget will be presented and reviewed at the August meeting.

The membership will vote on the proposed dues increase at the July meeting. It is important that you do your best to attend this (daytime) meeting so we have enough members present to establish a quorum for voting. Signing in as you arrive documents that a quorum was present. Until the decision is made about increasing dues, we will NOT be collecting dues during the July meeting for new or renewing members.

Janome Memory Craft 15000 – Horizon Quilt Maker Embroidery Machine – Plus Extras








