San Joaquin Valley Quilters' Guild 2024-2025 Budget Explanation

INCOME (many not included in projection)

<u>Advertising in newsletter by retailers</u>-Cathy Lee will assist in getting retail advertisers such as AVS, D & J, Quilted Goat, Totally Tina's, A & A, Bear Paw(Oakhurst), Calico Mermaid(Porterville-part of shop hop, mail orders & live on FB), Niki's - Kerman, Thimble Towne-Bakersfield

Membership Dues Increase in membership to \$40-members 100 @ \$40

Women's Conference Grant \$1,000 (this is not guaranteed or included)

Quilter's Yard Sale- We are planning to hold an event where we rent space to members, other Guilds and their members to sell. Date and location are not finalized yet.

<u>Retreat</u>-This event is scheduled to start Apri 21 for 3 days and will include expanded attendance.

<u>Studio Tour</u>- The projection is for 50 attendees @ \$10 which will be scheduled for the spring. <u>WIP</u> -Carol Shervum will chair. We will run for 6 months @ \$10 for a entry to list 10 items you will try to complete in six months.

EXPENSES

BOARD MEETINGS will be by zoom. No cost to the Guild, better control/less sidetracks of the meetings. Saves \$45 a month

CHALLENGE QUILTS- The Guild will no longer have a paid judge. Members can vote on winners 1,2, & 3.

OTHER EXPENSE DETAIL - Challenge quilt \$50, Studio tour \$25, Janitor-Christmas \$200, Guild dues \$50, Office \$50, President's quilt \$100, State fees \$55, WIP \$75

SCHOLARSHIP- Guild is not in the position to fund at this time. Suggestions have been made for alternatives such as mentoring, gift cards to members for a workshop(which can be discussed in the future.)

STORAGE UNIT- Contents have been moved to a 5X5 unit. Credit from the old unit has been applied to the 2025 annual cost of \$540.60. We still have a small credit.

<u>WORKSHOPS</u>-to date, workshop costs are not being covered. The Church does not have space available except on an hourly rate of \$45. Fresno County Libraries are a good alternative but can only be reserved 45 days ahead.

DOTTIE'S FINDINGS – Dottie Daybell

August 2024 Findings

1. Down a new rabbit hole! Lynn at Klein Meisje posted about a top she'd made using a 2023 pillow pattern from Jamie Siel. She included a link to Jamie's blog and to the free pattern on Riley Blake's blog. I have two new blogs to follow.

2. Patriotic BOM: I like the scrappy QOV posted by Alycia. It's just a photo, no pattern:

https://alyciaquilts.blogspot.com/2024/06/a-scrappy-qov-and-finished-or-not-friday.html

Here's my analysis: make 10" finished star blocks, border them with 1" finished strips to make 12" blocks and set them with a bunch of scrappy 2" x 4" finished rectangles. To make the floating star points, cut 3.5" x 4.5" rectangles, and 2.5" squares to sew diagonally across two corners. The star center is a 4.5" cut square and the corners are 3.5" cut squares. The 10" stars with borders look much better than 12" stars would.

3. The Seattle Modern Quilt Guild does an annual Block of the Month. In the last few years, they've been for members only, but this year's BOM is open to everyone. It started in February, but you can find all the monthly posts here:

All the instructions are shown on that page, with the most recent month at the top, but you'll also find, for each month, a link to download a PDF version of the pattern, and sometimes a separate link to templates. It takes a bit of searching; sometimes the link is just labeled with a blue "here".

4. Saija from Finland does it again! Her Bow Tie quilt is stunning. She shows us how she planned her colors using 2.5" squares on her design wall, before making her little 4" blocks. Google Translate will give you the details.

5. Bonnie Hunter does an annual Leader & Ender quilt, meant to be pieced bit by bit as you make other quilts. This year's quilt uses only squares and rectangles. No triangles to trim or bias seams to press. Part way down the page, there's a link to a PDF.




