The Guild has a table/booth in the Home Arts building at the fair where we display and sell tickets for our Opportunity quilt. We also display samples of our contributions to the community (comfort quilts, duffle bags, dream bags, etc.) and answer questions from the public. *Volunteers are provided with parking/entry passes. Two guild members at a time are needed to be at our table during the fair hours. It is usually a 3-hour (or longer if you are able) time slot. Carol develops a schedule for each day of the fair. If you sign up early, you can choose the best days and times for you. Sign up together with a friend or by yourself and make a new friend.

UPDATE on FAIR PARKING

We no longer can park on Butler Ave, we have to park off of Maple by Benny's grocery store, which is behind the gas station on corner of Butler and Maple.

She doesn't give a pattern, but we can figure it out! It's the same block as Julie Cefalu's pattern, linked below, but set differently. The key to Jeri's set is alternating blue-star-red-corner blocks with red-starblue-corner blocks, so you get those cool red and blue on-point squares. I'd like it better without the white-center blocks.

Road to California





INDEPENDENCE HALL QUILTERS FAIRE


