It was a phase she never quite outgrew. After completing college, while trying to get excited about the transition to a corporate career, Kate saw a want ad for a bead store and lost no time in applying. Soon she was teaching classes and writing articles that were published regularly in magazines. During this time, she took a basic metalworking class at a local community college that opened her eyes to the possibilities of what metalworking had to offer the jewelry designer. She began teaching metalworking to the masses and never looked back. Simply put, Kate Richbourg loves jewelry. She loves to teach it. She loves to make it. She loves to wear it. Teaching and designing jewelry since 1992, she teaches at national shows, bead societies and bead shops and is published in a variety of jewelry magazines and is the author of the popular blog "We Can Make That at Home. She has also appeared on several episodes of the DIY and HGTV network shows "DIY Jewelry" and "Craft Lab." Kate is the author of the best-selling book Simple Soldering: A Beginner's Guide to Jewelry Making.


The 2024-2025 **membership cards and name badges** are available at the monthly meeting. Stop by the membership table to pick them up.

CHILDREN'S PROJECTS - Sharon Weber

At the January meeting we received 32 pillowcases, 11 wheelchair bags, 7 accessory bags, 2 balls and 6 dresses.

Valley Children's is asking for volunteers to sew bags for patients' belongings using the surgical sterile wrapping material. This project was started by a nurse who is trying to decrease the amount of material sent to the landfill. The disposable bags will be given to surgical patients on discharge to carry their belongings. I will bring material to the meeting for those who are interested. Use your imagination to spruce the bags up.

Gilbert and his wife Stacey are my contact for MuddyEyes. They provide food for the homeless and help with transition to shelters. BJ and I made about 200 drawstring bags last year for hygiene products to be distributed. I will keep collecting bags and hygiene supplies this year. Gilbert & Stacey will represent Muddy Eyes and Cheryl will represent Shriner's at our March meeting to describe their work and how we help them.

I am working on having one day a month to make kits for pillow cases or bags or dresses. Members will be notified via newsletter and/or e-blast. The next date to make kits is Wednesday, February 5 at the Fig Garden Library from 10-12. I will bring fabric & cutting supplies to kit pillow cases and cut dresses. Hopefully the March date will have a large room available for 4 hours.
