#### MAY 2025 FINDINGS

I'm having a big birthday this month, my 90th, and in celebration of the number 9, all the links are about 9-patch blocks. They are not modern but are vintage like me.

1. Lori went to a 2023 exhibit of Southern quilts at the New England Quilt Museum and posted a photo of a 9-patch quilt I wish I owned. It's the fourth quilt down, and it makes me smile.

2. Patriotic BOM: Melisa made patriotic 4-patch/9-patch blocks, based on an antique quilt she saw on Bonnie Hunter's blog. She has two posts showing the blocks. Follow her link to Bonnie Hunter's blog post to see the original vintage quilt.

3. Jo posted a photo of a quilt made by Diane and quilted by Ronda. It looks complicated, but it's just a 9-patch with HSTs in its corners, set straight with no sashing. The blocks look rectangular, but they're not. I love its clean lines with the white background and bright colors.

4. Martha's blog is no longer active, but it lives on at the Internet Archive. In 2009, she posted a "9-Patch and Snowball" quilt, with wonderfully scrappy blocks hand-pieced from vintage fabrics. The only constant is that her 9-patches all have one diagonal line of solids through their centers, and they're set with that line running vertically. Each block is a little collection of coordinated colors, and the triangles on the adjoining snowballs seem planned, too. (It takes a bit of time for the page to load its images, which are worth the wait.)




